“OCD in Children and Adolescents: Family Based Strategies and Interventions”

Family dysfunction does not cause Obsessive-Compulsive Disorder (OCD), but family members nonetheless affect and are affected by a child with OCD. Clinical findings strongly indicate that treatment tailored to the child’s developmental needs and family context offers a promising intervention that may minimize the chronic nature of OCD.
